INTRODUCING JULIE WESTLAKE - READER IN TRAINING: Julie is a Reader in training from Bengeworth who is doing her 10 week placement in the Pershore Benefice from May to July.

"I feel very privileged to be spending my two month placement at Pershore Benefice, and am grateful to Claire for making this opportunity available to me. I am on the first year of my LLM (Reader's) Course at Queen's Foundation, Birmingham. I am already trained as an ALM in Worship – although Covid restrictions put paid to much practical experience as I was about to enter that stage of my training when everything became 'virtual'.

I was born in Evesham and my family were fruit growers in the Vale. Sadly the orchards have gone, but for a couple of acres the family retain as a reminder of our heritage. I have spent all of my life in the Vale apart from a few years living in Cambridge when my husband's work took us there. Steve worked at BBC Woodnorton and also London, and is now retired.



My background is in Business Strategy and Communications and my working life has been mostly spent as a lecturer - in the Further and Higher Education Sector. RESULTS IN FOR SEVERN TRENT LOO FUNDING: Sadly we didn't win the vote but we have received a healthy contribution from Severn Trent to our water saving project and will bring you more news soon! Thank you to everyone who voted and engaged with our campaign.

A PLEA TO HELP SAVE COSTS - TURN THOSE LIGHTS OFF; THAT HEATING DOWN:

You will be well aware of the rising cost of energy in your home. Did you know that the Abbey and St Andrew's are also affected, but even more so? There is no "cap" for us, no £150 or £200. We buy our energy through Parish Buying (the bulk buying arm of the C of E), usually through a contract with Total Energies. In February there were 6 contracts (nationally) available - we got 4 of them - and then only till September.

Our budgets for 2022 are:-

GAS	£17000	IFOUUU	that's £33,000! Our total bill for both buildings in 2021 was £14,000.
ELECTRICTY	£7250		

A typical meeting for 2 hours in St Andrew's has the heating switched on for 3 hours before and the heating bill for that meeting is £30.

We are reaping the benefits of the new LED lighting in our buildings - that investment has reduced our electricity consumption by over 25%. We are about to provide better controls on our boilers and thank FOPA for funding the Abbey one.

With your help we might well be able to at least contain these costs.

We would ask you, please, that:-

- a) if you have to cancel a meeting in St Andrew's you tell us so we don't heat an empty building
- b) if the meeting finishes early you switch the heating off (Roger or I will show you)
- c) switch those lights off if you don't need them
- d) shut those doors

Let's see if by working together we can save 10%!

ST ANDREW'S CENTRE

CAR PARKING AT ST ANDREW'S: St Andrew's is now, happily, very busy again. However, this does put pressure on the small number of parking spaces at the back of the building. These spaces are mainly for those who hire the building and need access for various reasons. The first space is reserved for the Vicar so that when she is in a hurry to take funerals and services etc., and not on her trusty bike, she can get in. Please do not park in St Andrew's unless you have a good reason involving that building, not the Abbey. We are sorry we have to restrict parking in this way, but it is so limited that we have no choice.

<u>ST ANDREW'S CENTRE MANAGEMENT – HELP NEEDED</u>: St Andrew's Centre is now extremely busy with lots of new hirers and new activities. We have two outstanding helpers in organising and managing bookings and maintaining the building in Robin and Roger. But they could really do with some more help. We need an active and practical person to provide this help – could it be you? There is no pay but a wonderful sense of achievement! If you can help, please talk to Robin, Roger, the Churchwardens or let the Office know.


