Jayne will be ordained deacon next July and then will serve as a Self Supporting Assistant Curate.



240731 Lance Corporal E. A. Giles, Worcestershire Regiment. Died 27 November 1918. Age 31

2434240 Corporal D. Larber, Royal Air Force.

Died 6 February 1951. Age 20

5350952 Private R. A. Smith, Pioneer Corps.

Died 12 June 1943. Age 19

MOTHERS UNION AT PERSHORE ABBEY

MOTHERS' UNION DIOCESAN CELEBRATION: On July 25 Pershore Abbey hosted the Mothers' Union Diocesan Festival with 133 members from across the Diocese, Dudley to Malvern. They brought and proudly paraded their branch banners culminating in the Diocesan Banner. Bishop John lead the service ably assisted by our 2 chaplains, Mother Victoria, representing the Northern Archdeaconry, and Rev. Canon Stephen Buckley, representing the Southern Archdeaconry. Rev. Stephen produced the service sheet celebrating the Feast of the Transfiguration echoing the Mothers' Union theme for the year, 'Transformation Now'.

Bishop John welcomed a member of the Worldwide Trustees, The Provincial President of Canterbury Province Mrs. Julie Jamieson and her husband, along with the Coventry Diocesan President Mrs Karen Morris and her husband. He also welcomed our other guests - Bishop Godfrey of Morogoro and his wife Tumaini and Bishop Jorge, the Bishop of Peru and his wife Sandra. They are our Diocesan link Dioceses and were on their way to the Lambeth Conference.

Instead of a sermon, Bishop John invited Tumaini to tell us about the work of the Mothers' Union in Morogoro. She only speaks Swahili, so her husband Bishop Godfrey translated and then Bishop John then encouraged Tumaini to sing a Gospel Alleluia Chorus. Her voice filled the Abbey and inspired us with our singing. The Mothers' Union members of the Abbey choir were supplemented by other members from around the Diocese. The hymns and responses were accompanied by a visiting organist, Mr. Mike Perrier.

The Bishop commissioned our Diocesan President, Judith, and the Diocesan Trustees. Long Service Awards were distributed to members of Evesham and Pershore Deanery members for 30, 40 and 65 years.

After the service, members and visitors went across to St. Andrew's to enjoy fellowship and plenty of cakes provided by members from Worcester Archdeaconry and many cups of tea. Everyone felt uplifted by the service, encouraged in their work for the Mothers' Union and connected to their work across the world.

Thank you to the Abbey team, Churchwardens Suzanne and Sam, sound Peter, Richard our Verger and Robin as Crucifer and most of all PASA and Pershore members for helping with refreshments and organising St. Andrew's, making it a day to remember!

VISIT TO ORGANIC FRUIT TREE NURSERY

SATURDAY 1 OCTOBER AT 0955

Join us at Kevin O'Neill's Organic Fruit Tree Wallcott Nursery, WR10 2AL for a brief description of the work of a fruit tree nursery, the challenges of going organic, a selection of apples to taste and a demonstration of bud grafting. Most fruit trees in the UK have their roots and trunk from different plants.

You are welcome to visit by car, but please go the long way round via Drakes Broughton so you do not loose your car in the deep ford. As it is a **Great Big Green Week** event, we are encouraging the adventurous to go by bus, catching the white bus no. 566 leaving Broad Street bus stop (by the Lingerie Shop) at 0934 reaching Pershore railway station about 0942. We will then have a 10 min walk to Wallcott from there, there is a footbridge over the ford. There is a bus back at 1052 from the railway station, but for those interested there will be an accompanied gentle 2.5 mile walk from Wallcott back to Pershore via Gig Bridge and Pershore Hall back to Broad Street. No need to book - just turn up on the day!

YOU DID SEE IT BUT IT'S NOW GONE!: In early August the Pershore Abbey Biodiversity area between the Abbey and the car park was mown in readiness for the Plum Festival. The area of about a fifth of an acre with radiating paths through it was left unmown from late March for just over four months.

We hope you have been aware of it. Some of you would have participated in the outdoor Morning Praise in July where it was the back drop. It has linked well with other adjacent unmown areas in Abbey Park and St Andrews's Gardens.

However it will be returning! In September or when conditions permit, with Wychavon DC help, the area will be marked out again, scarified to expose some soil and sown with wild flower seed. Huge thanks to Pershore Rotary who are once again funding the cost of the seed. We will be involving school children in this. The more community involvement the better!

The aim is to try to increase the diversity of plants on the site where certain grasses have come to dominate after years of mowing and attract pollinating insects. Autumn is a good time to sow seed with the soil still warm for germination to happen over the following months.

PAPER WHICH DOESN'T COST THE EARTH!: Here in the office we are doing our bit for the environment and eco church by trying to cut down on unnecessary paper usage.

Post-Covid we have continued to use email as much as possible rather than incur the environmental cost of paper (and postage!): wedding packs are sent by email; booking forms have becoming electronic; posters are re-used where possible and we only print where possible are the smooth running and admin

where necessary for the smooth running and admin of the office.

Our general use paper is an environmentally friendly, recycled and FSC certified product from the C of E approved list with our supplier.

Despite the cost benefits of being part of a C of E buying group, we've seen a huge increase in the cost of paper this year due to the world situation, strikes in European paper mills and increasing costs.

We have also had some work done to strengthen the shelving in our warehouse so no-one need be worried about overloading us with supplies (see below).

Over the Summer holidays we have supplied extra food to families with children by offering them extra parcels at fortnightly intervals. Unusually, we have also been seeing a few much older clients and, since I know what a neighbourly community this is, I'd like to remind everyone that there is no stigma attached to using the Foodbank. We are a friendly group of volunteers and, as well as offering deliveries to those who cannot carry large quantities of supplies, we also offer various referrals to other sources of help. And, hopefully, a cup of tea and a listening ear. If you know of any older person who may be going short over the coming months, do please encourage them to use our services or even better, bring them in to meet us.

On the subject of donations: we are well stocked with basic foodstuffs for the time being but your generosity is always appreciated. We seem to be perennially in need of the unglamorous household items such cleaning products but are, for once, well stocked with cat and dog food. Now that both the chocolate and biscuit mountains have been exhausted, some sweet treats some "naughty but nice" would be very much appreciated.


