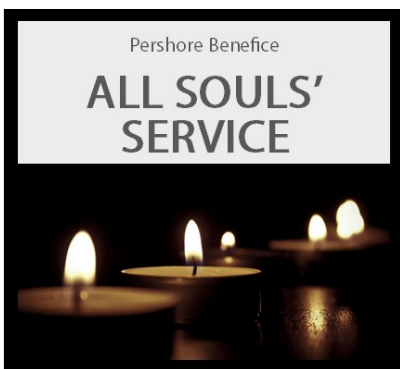

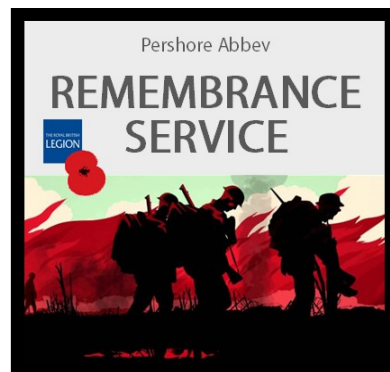
PERSHORE BENEFICE REMEMBRANCE SERVICES

ST MARY'S, WICK 1500 13 NOVEMBER: Join Wick village as they gather round the war memorial in the churchyard.



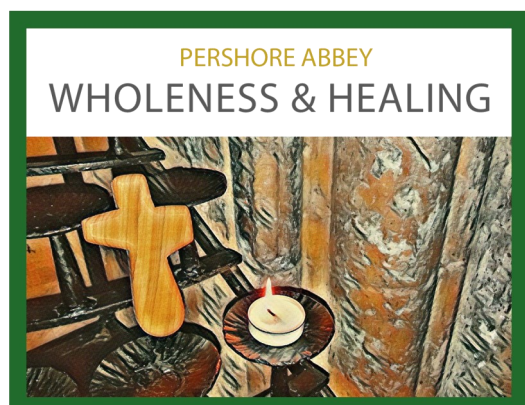

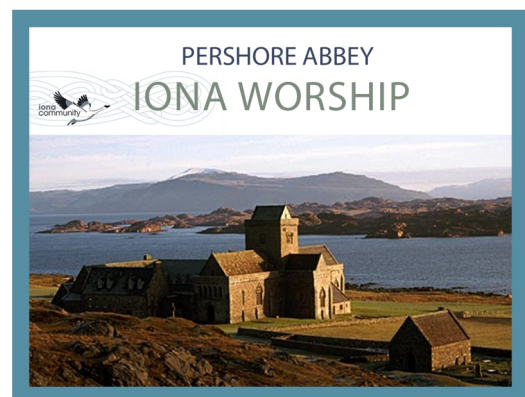

Between October 15 – 25 Mothers' Union, along with the Clewer Initiative and the Salvation Army, are highlighting the dark and cruel practice of 'Modern Slavery'.

Members have been informed about the areas where modern slavery occurs and they have been encouraged, if they see sign of people being exploited, to inform the police or their parish priests.

Pershore Mothers' Union, along with other branches, are putting up a display to inform members of their congregations and members of the public who may visit our churches about this issue. Modern slavery affects men and women, people of every colour and creed and in country areas may involve young people who are enticed into drug trafficking through County Lines.

PERSHORE ABBEY ORGAN FESTIVAL - SAVE THE DATE!: Plans are underway for an exciting Organ Festival to celebrate the installation of our new Ruffatti Pipe Organ next year. We hope to be able to share more details about the Festival soon, but for now, please save the date **20 - 23 April 2023.** Do join us as we finally realise our **Pipe Dream.**

A NEW PIPE ORGAN FOR PERSHORE ABBEY IN 2023

Pershore Abbey has been planning and fundraising for the purchase and installation of a new pipe organ since the old Walker/Nicholson pipe organ was removed from the Abbey during the 1996 restoration of the Abbey, and temporarily replaced by the Bradford electronic organ.

We are pleased to announce that the outcome of the research and endeavours of the PCC during the past seven years will now happily come to fruition with the installation of the new organ in early 2023.

The new organ will not only enable us to have beautiful music at all our services but will also allow many different types of concert and musical events to take place in the Abbey. It is being built by Fratelli Ruffatti, an internationally renowned family organ builder based in Padua, Italy, and selected from some eight organ builders located in the UK and across Western Europe. It will be delivered to the Abbey for installation beginning in January 2023 and completed by April 2023.

This project has been seriously delayed firstly by the effects Covid 19, and then by consequential component supply difficulties in Italy. However, visitors to the Abbey will note that we have already installed two platforms to support the organ casings, and much enabling work took place during 2020 and early 2022 in the roof space behind the platforms to create a blower room. We have also installed a new ladder to the blower room to provide access for tuning and maintenance of the organ once installed.

The main works remaining are the installation process and associated scaffolding. Based on the timings required by Ruffatti, and to ensure completion by Easter 2023, an intensive programme of work is required.

Voicing is an extremely specialist task that requires complete silence in the Abbey, and it will be necessary to completely close the Abbey during this final and most sensitive part of the organ installation. The whole installation process will be overseen by Robert Kilgour, Abbey Architect, Clive Haywood, Abbey Structural Engineer, and Matthew Martin, Abbey Organ Advisor, and when they and the PCC are content with all aspects of the installation, the organ will formally be handed over to the Abbey. Plans are in hand to arrange an Organ Festival to celebrate the wonderful benefits that this new, powerful, and versatile instrument will bring to the Abbey congregation and the wider community for generations to come.



We ask regular users and visitors to the Abbey to bear with us during these periods of restricted access and inconvenience.

The PCC is most grateful for the financial support provided especially by the Friends of Pershore Abbey and those members of the congregation and wider community who have made donations towards the organ pipes. This project would not have been possible without this most generous support.

PERSHORE ABBEY BIODIVERSITY AREA - AN UPDATE

Having been mown prior to the Plum Festival the area is being reinstated this autumn by sowing wildflower seeds more extensively. The area is going to be scarified early in October to loosen the grass and expose some bare soil. Children from Holy Redeemer 'Eco Gardening Club' will be joining us on the afternoon of **Thursday 13 October** to sow the seed, the purchase of which has been greatly funded by Pershore Rotary.

The aim of sowing in the autumn is to allow as much of the seed to germinate in the following weeks and not be out competed by the established grasses. They will then have a better chance of survival when growth resumes next spring. Nothing is certain with nature but autumn sowing is certainly better than sowing in the spring. The seed mix contains over 20 species of native wildflowers, mostly perennials, with a few annuals and biennials. Also we been kindly given by the Vale Landscape Heritage Trust some valuable locally gathered Yellow Rattle.

We wish for the area to be part of the community and are really looking forward to the school's participation in this event and hopefully others in the future. If you would like to help on the sowing day please let the Abbey Office know on office@pershoreabbey.org.uk. They will put you in touch with the Eco Church land group.

We are looking for one other person to join us going forward. Though not much will happen until the spring, we would like to arrange a few activities around the Biodiversity area through next year. If you are interested in joining a small team and can give a little time we would really like to hear from you.

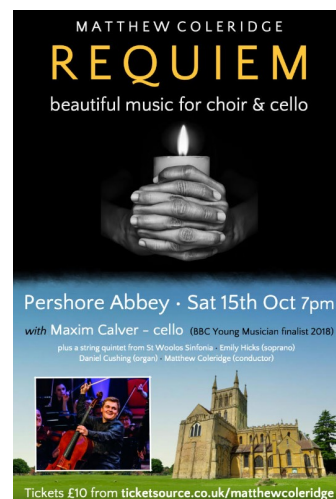
