The Gospel – Luke 4:16-24

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

Glory to you, O Lord.

When he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written: 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.' And he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. The eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. Then he began to say to them, 'Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing.' All spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth. They said, 'Is not this Joseph's son?' He said to them, 'Doubtless you will quote to me this proverb, "Doctor, cure yourself!" And you will say, "Do here also in your home town the things that we have heard you did at Capernaum."' And he said, 'Truly I tell you, no prophet is accepted in the prophet's home town.



A NEW CHILDREN AND FAMILIES WORKER FOR THE ABBEY: In March the PCC held an 'away day' (in St Andrew's) and developed our strategy for the next few years. Our key priority was seen as developing our mission to children, young people, and families. We have built on this using the Healthier Churches Fund from the Diocese to seek funding for a half time Children and Families worker.

A small group (Claire, Peter, Suzanne and Martin Fowler) then developed the job details with help from Simon Hill of the Young Disciples Team and sought funding for a half time post for 5 years.

I am delighted to say that the Bishop's Council approved the post in principle recently and further discussions with John Preston, Diocesan Secretary allowed Claire to accept the offer of funding from the Diocese to let us proceed. We will now move forward with advertising the post locally and more widely with the Diocese, if necessary. This is a marvellous opportunity for us to move forward with our strategy of developing our mission to young people, and with families as we move forward. *Peter Stansbie*

<u>VOCATIONS MARKETPLACE EVENT - TUESDAY 15 NOVEMBER 2022:</u> A virtual Zoom event from the Diocese of Worcester for those wanting to explore God's call on their lives and particularly those beginning to think about some form of ministry in the church.

The event will focus on:

- Ordained Ministry (stipendiary and self-supporting)
- · Licensed Lay Ministry / Reader
- Authorized Lay Ministry (esp. Pastoral and Worship streams)
- Youth & Children's work (inc. ALM Youth & Children's stream)
- Not sure / Those who are not sure exactly what God is calling them to.

There are of course a whole variety of other ways people live out their vocations, but the aim is to deliberately keep this event relatively tightly focused.

During the evening participants will consider some general principles around vocation and ministry and there is the offer of breakout sessions on each of the above bullet points, with the people responsible for selection and training for these. Everyone attending will have the opportunity to join two of these breakout sessions, so they don't need to have a specific ministry in mind, but it would be good to think in advance about which two workshop sessions might be of most benefit to you if you wish to attend.
