HARVEST FESTIVAL ROUNDUP

We had a wonderful range of Harvest Festival services across the Benefice this Autumn, and thanks to the generosity of our congregations at Pershore Abbey, St Mary's, St James' and St Nicholas, we were able to share the fruits of our bountiful harvest and food collections with the Foodbank and help those facing a difficult and uncertain winter.

Pershore Abbey received a letter of thanks from Lynne Raymer of Pershore Foodbank for their generous donations this year, which totalled a staggering **69kg** of food - that's the equivalent of around **164 meals**, while Pinvin donated **25kg** of food which roughly equates to **59** meals.



Our churches looked absolutely beautiful too, with fantastic arrangements of flowers, fruit and seasonal produce. Wick produced a beautiful foam-free display which embraced our eco-mission fully.

SOME THOUGHTS FROM THE ORCHARD IN WICK:

These apples and pears have all come from one orchard in Wick and as I was picking them it occurred to me what a metaphor for life the orchard was. Lots of different varieties living alongside each other, some were young trees whilst others were dead or on the decline. Fruits came in all shapes, tastes, sizes and colours and some had genetic faults and others had damage due to a variety of reason inflicted on them from life in the orchard. But they were all living in God's Orchard. They also were all destined to become something different; some would be juiced and others made into cider or Perry, some were good eaters and others keepers, yet others food for birds, wasps, and small mammals, or if they stayed where they dropped then they would provide fertility for next year's crop.

I wonder what we are intended to become?

What a shame the world can not be as accepting as the orchards.

MOTHER'S UNION FOCUS ON VIOLENCE



16 DAYS OF ACTIVISM FOR THE ELIMINATION OF VIOLENCE

Every year this movement takes place from 25 November (The International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women) until 10 December (World Human Rights Day). During these 16 days people around the world will unite to raise awareness about gender based violence, challenge discriminatory attitudes and call for improved laws and services for women who are affected by violence.

In many countries young girls have to undergo female genital mutilation as part of their culture. The Mothers' Union works with local people to educate village elders to change their attitudes and make this practice illegal.

Many societies see women as possessions with no rights; the Mothers' Union pays local workers to inform women of their rights and work with whole families to change attitudes and encourage mutual respect in families.


In this country, Domestic Violence affects all levels of society and the Mothers' Union is working with Women's Aid to educate people about this problem.

In our Diocese Mothers' Union supports 2 refuges that offer a safe place for women and their children. They offer physical, moral and spiritual support and offer trauma counselling. They work with the women to build up their confidence and train them with skills which will help them find work, a home and security.

During the Marriage Preparation sessions we offer to those getting married in our Benefice, the team raise the subject of Domestic Violence and give out a leaflet with the addresses and contact details of organisations that can help those experiencing abuse.

IONA PILGRIMAGE SEPTEMBER 2022

Six Christian Pilgrims gathered for prayer on Worcester Parkway's Northbound platform on Friday 23 September 2022. Their journey was to take them to the Island of Iona off the coast of the larger Scottish island of Mull in the Inner Hebrides. With 25 or so other visitors, they were due to stay with members of the Iona community at Iona Abbey for 6 nights. Whilst there, the pilgrims would participate in all the Abbey's daily activities including housekeeping tasks, morning and evening church services, study, singing, healthy walks and a trip to the even remoter and uninhabited island of Staffa to marvel at Fingal's Cave.

The island of Iona is 4 miles long and less than 1 mile wide with a permanent population of 170. It has a primary school with 17 pupils. At the age of 11 school children must leave Iona and travel on a Monday morning to secondary school in Oban on the mainland and return late on Friday evenings. Thousands of visitors throng the quiet country lanes of the island during the summer season to visit the Abbey & its museum.



Arriving on Iona

36 hours after setting off, we stepped ashore on the island. The weather was sunny, warm, and welcoming. The journey had been pleasant but long. It necessitated an overnight stay in a comfortable Oban hotel. As train trips go, the journey had been uneventful. Four different trains conveyed our pilgrims north. The final 3-hour leg from Glasgow to Oban runs alongside the Clyde before climbing into the highlands to look down on the Faslane Submarine base before skirting Lochs Lomond & Awe. The scenery is stunning at any time of year and our Pilgrims were dazzled by the autumnal colours as they travelled ever northwards.

Upon arrival at Iona Abbey our pilgrims were introduced to the remaining guests with whom friendships would be formed in the coming days. Some had travelled much further than our Worcestershire pilgrims. Two ministers were from New York, another was from Canada. An elderly German couple taught us much about patience and love. A full programme of talks and activities was on offer. Some guests had arrived with specific aims of their own in mind. One man (a priest) was writing a hymn and took himself off for long walks around the island seeking inspiration from the landscape that, centuries before, had attracted monks from Ireland to settle and build the Abbey. Others had brought skills with them that they wished to share – art workshops were planned for the creative.

As the days unfolded our pilgrims were exposed to the community's daily regime and to the realities of island life with everything an Atlantic coastal existence brings. The weather is a dominant factor. What to wear (waterproofs or t-shirts) is a constant topic. The (unheated) Abbey church provided our pilgrims with a reminder of what hardier worshippers normally experience as nights draw in and extra thermal layers become a requirement.

The underlying theme of the week "Time and Space" drew our pilgrims again and again to focus on bible study, worship, and the company of fellow pilgrims. As we got to know one another we were again reminded of the Christian unity we can all enjoy. The Iona Community is ecumenical - being open to all believing Christians irrespective of their affiliations. We discovered that bridge building is much more fun than erecting barriers and that there are unspoken levels of belief that simply transcend definition. "Preach the Gospel at all times and if necessary, use words" is an encouragement attributed to St. Francis of Assisi.

What a powerful reminder of such a simple truth!

And who can argue with the statement that God's love conquers all? The love of God tears down the power of sin in our lives, heals bitterness, and causes us to want the best for other believers.

Having been warned of approaching storms, our pilgrims returned a day early to Worcestershire - making the return trip in fourteen hours.

They ended, as they began, with prayer on the station platform. *Michael Hodges*



<u>VOCATIONS MARKETPLACE EVENT - TUESDAY 15 NOVEMBER 2022:</u> A virtual Zoom event from the Diocese of Worcester for those wanting to explore God's call on their lives and particularly those beginning to think about some form of ministry in the church. The event will focus on:

ECO CHURCH

PERSHORE ABBEY BIODIVERSITY AREA - AN UPDATE

On **Thursday 13 October** the Eco Church Land Group was joined by the nearby Holy Redeemer Primary School Eco Club in re-establishing the Biodiversity area on the Abbey grounds. The perimeter of the area and some internal circles were scarified last week by Wychavon District Council Contractors to expose the soil ahead of the sowing. The aim was to expose around 50% soil. Autumn is a good time for seed sowing. There is some residual warmth in the soil, it will remain damp through the autumn & winter and enable germination of the seed ahead of proper growth next spring.

A seed mix that included 26 different wildflowers was sown, including Ox Eye Daisy, Knapweed, Poppy, Ragged Robin, Scabious, Yarrow. Additionally some locally gathered Yellow Rattle seed was sown, donated by the Vale Landscape Heritage Trust, in a few areas. Yellow Rattle is a parasite of grass and will reduce its vigour if it can get a hold. We do not expect the area to be a blaze of colour next summer but are hopeful of some success. It would be really good to attract bees and other pollinating insects. Nature will do its work, we have tried to give the sowing the best chance of success so fingers crossed!

It was really good to be joined by the children. They were really enthusiastic and very much got 'stuck in'. It is great to involve the local community in an Abbey project like this and we look forward to inviting them again to participate in future activities. They went away with plans to create there own wildflower area on their school grounds!



GOOD NEWS! Pershore Town Council have awarded us a grant for **£104.50** to cover the remainder of the cost for the wildflower seed! Many thanks to the Town Council for their support of this project, along with Pershore Rotary and Wychavon District Council.

<u>COST CUTTING SUCCESS!</u> A recent reading of the Abbey and St Andrew's Gas and Electric meters revealed good news! Compared with previous years, our consumption is well down - which is a great result for our Zero carbon targets and also for our costs. Take a look at our ECO boards for more information.

It's a big thank you to you all - for bearing with the reduced heating, keeping those doors shut and the lights switched off. It's a thank you too to the Friends of Pershore Abbey for funding those boiler controls and new lighting, for Wychavon for funding the boiler controls in St Andrew's and to the lottery players for the St Andrew's lighting.

CHURCHES TOGETHER IN PERSHORE FOODBANK

The Foodbank received a record-breaking number of donations over the Harvest Festival period. This has been heartening, not just for our vulnerable and increasingly anxious clients, but also for our hard-pressed volunteers. I'm delighted to be able to tell you that this year those stalwart individuals will be at last having their first proper Christmas "bash" since before the pandemic.

We have been getting together with some of our partners in the community: the Wellbeing Hub, Volunteer Centre, Riverside Centre, Community Cupboard, Abbey Park School (please excuse me if I have overlooked anyone) in order to share information and ideas. Hopefully, this joined-up approach will help us all to target those individuals most in need of support and ensure that no-one in Pershore and the surrounding area falls through the net.

Both the "Warm in Bed" scheme for winter-weight bedding and the "Fruit Salad" vouchers for fresh fruit and vegetables are working out well and have been extremely positively received. These locally-administered ideas are funded by Pershore Foodbank from your very generous donations but would not be possible without the kind support of the management and staff at the Pershore Factory Shop and Fruit Salad greengrocers.


