THE ADVENT WREATH

We have this advent wreath to remind us of the coming of Jesus, the Light of the World

The holly and the ivy are dancing in a ring, round the berry bright candles, and the white and shining King.

And one for God's people, in every age and day, we are watching for his coming. We believe and we obey.

O, two is for the prophets and for the light they bring. They are candles in the darkness, all alight for Christ the King.

And three for John the Baptist He calls us on to sing: 'O prepare the way for Jesus Christ. He is coming, Christ the King'. We light this candle to remind us of Mother Mary who said she would obey.

And four for Mother Mary 'I cannot see the way, but you promise me a baby I believe and I obey'

We come together to worship and praise God, to ask forgiveness for our wrongdoings and to hear the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Lord direct our thoughts, teach us to pray, lift up our hearts to worship you in spirit and in truth, through Jesus Christ.

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Gospel

Matthew 1.18-25

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew

Glory to you, O Lord.

The birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.' All this took place to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

'Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel',

which means, 'God is with us.' When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife, but had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; and he named him Jesus.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.
