# **REMEMBERING THE FALLEN**

#### **REMEMBERING IN WICK:**

The churchyard of St Mary's in Wick was crowded on a very warm afternoon as Villagers and Veterans gathered to pay their respects during the Annual Remembrance Sunday Service held at the War Memorial.

The service was led by Canon Claire Lording with the names of the Fallen read by Charles Hudson whose family lost 3 men during WW1 - all commemorated on the War Memorial. Following the act of Remembrance, wreaths were laid and prayers offered.

### **AND IN PERSHORE:**

A special act of remembrance this Armistice Day in Pershore saw its ancient Abbey floodlit in poppy red light.

The Lantern tower, which can be seen for miles across the district, was most striking.

It served as a poignant reminder of the human cost of war which saw the town lose 101 young men during the First World War and a further 24 during the Second World War.

On Remembrance Sunday the parade of Veterans and Cadets marched through the town to Pershore Abbey to attend the annual Remembrance Service led by Canon Claire Lording.

Following the parade, a short service of Remembrance organised by creator Sue Cosnett (centre) was held at Pershore Warhorse Memorial and was attended by a great many people, horses and dogs ending with the national silence being observed at 1100.

# **NEWS FROM THE VILLAGES**

THE PINVIN CHRISTMAS EVE ROCKET: The idea of a Rocket on Christmas Eve was originally conceived back in the late 1980's. The father of one of the Pinvin village resident families suggested we set off a big rocket at the end of the Christmas Eve church service to symbolise the Star that the three kings would follow to locate baby Jesus and pay homage to him with gifts. The idea was discussed and approved, and we have been setting off our Christmas Eve rocket ever since! As we see the rocket explode in the night sky it symbolises the 'Star and Light': the way to follow Christ. We use as big a rocket as possible so that all around us the rocket can be seen, as it will be this Christmas Eve when we launch at around 1800, following our Christingle and Crib service at 1700. Come and join us!

#### AUTHORISATION OF WICK CHURCHWARDEN, PENNY GORDON:

The Morning Praise Service at St Mary's Wick on Sunday 27 November was extra special as it included the authorisation of our Churchwarden Penny Gordon as an ALM (Authorised Lay Minister) – Worship Leader at St Mary's Wick.



For Penny, pictured here with Canon Claire Lording, receiving her certificate signed by Bishop John, this was the culmination of a process which started with an initial enquiry way back in March 2021. Having been accepted, Penny started her training in November 2021, this being a mixture of live sessions, Zoom and some thought provoking homework with the sessions being led by Canon Claire and Revd. Doug Chaplin the Discipleship and Lay Training Officer. Penny found the training both interesting and challenging as it gave insights about faith, the meaning of our services and how best we can communicate with others. Penny would highly recommend this route to ALM for anyone to both grow in faith and offer service to the church.

# **PIPE DREAMS - PERSHORE ABBEY ORGAN**

**PERSHORE ABBEY PIPE DREAM PROJECT - THE WORK BEGINS!:** We have already communicated an outline of the schedule of work to complete our long awaited organ installation. A copy of this document can be found in the November Monthly Bulletin and also on the Pipe Dreams board in the Abbey.

We now want to take this opportunity to give you advance notice of the impact this work will have on the Abbey in early **January** and into **February 2023**. We will update you on the impact on the Abbey during March as the work progresses.

#### ABBEY CLOSED 9 JANUARY - 18 JANUARY 2023:

There will be an intensive period of activity from **0700** to **1200 midnight every day** from **9** to **18 January 2023** to install scaffolding within the Abbey. During this period the Abbey will be **CLOSED**.

Our services on **15 January** will therefore take place in **St Andrew's**.

During this period there will be increased activity at the octagon roundabout to the west of the Abbey for the delivery of scaffolding and site personnel. The erection of the scaffolding internally will make use of hand held impact drivers to secure the connections. This will be noisy but we are hopeful that the noise should be contained within the Abbey.

#### ABBEY OPEN WITH RESTRICTED ACCESS TO SOME AREAS 23 JANUARY - 24 FEBRUARY 2023:

Work will take place in the Abbey from **0700** to **1900** Monday - Saturday. During this time we expect the Abbey to remain open, but access to areas where work is taking place may be restricted. The start date is currently flexible.

<u>ABBEY CLOSED 27 FEBRUARY - 3 MARCH 2023:</u> The work to remove the scaffolding will take place between **27 February** and **3 March**. This work will take place between **0700** and **1200 midnight** over this period. The Abbey will be **CLOSED**.

We will, of course, be communicating closely and clearly with all of our volunteers, congregation and visitors over this period to ensure that disruption is kept to a minimum.

Our **Daily Offices** and **Sunday Services** will continue to be observed throughout the period, but the venue may change, so please keep an eye on the weekly bulletin

As with all works, it may be necessary to adjust this schedule. We will use the weekly bulletin and the Monthly Edition, together with clear signage in and around the Abbey, to keep you informed.

# A SNOWY REFLECTION ON 60 YEARS A DEACON

In 1962 Bishop Oliver Tomkins had arranged that I would be ordained deacon at Bristol Cathedral at Michaelmas, shortly before my 28th birthday. However, the bishop wrote to say that my predecessor as assistant curate at St. Gregory, Horfield, was unable to move on, as his new appointment had fallen through. There was nowhere for me to move in, and since he was continuing in post for the time being, the diocese had no money allocated to pay the two of us in that post. He was sorry for this delay, and would write to me when the situation could be resolved.

I had to swallow my disappointment, find myself a temporary job, and somewhere to live at short notice. I began as a hospital porter at the Whittington Hospital in Highgate, and rented a room in Muswell Hill. In the middle of December the bishop wrote again to say that, although the previous curate had still not moved on, they had found some money to pay me, the parish would find me temporary digs with parishioners for the time being, and he would be able to make me a deacon at the Advent ordination on December 23.

I resigned from my hospital job, and reported to Barrow Court, near Bristol, for the preordination retreat. The weather had been warm for late December, but the ordination day dawned very clear and sunny, with a bitingly cold stiff breeze. I was ordained with three other deacons and one priest, and was asked to read the short Gospel from St. Matthew, chapter 9. After lunch with a small group of family and friends at a hotel near the Cathedral I went to my new parish and met the parishioners who had offered me a room.

That evening my duties began: I presided at the singing of choral Evensong, and was installed as their new curate. I was then plunged into the full range of services for Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

Bristol had three theatres: the famous 1766 King's Theatre, the Little Theatre in the Colston Hall (now renamed due to Edward Colston's association with the slave trade) and the 2,000 seat Hippodrome, where the annual Christmas pantomime was staged. My vicar, Kenneth Preston, was the chaplain at the Hippodrome. The panto began shortly before Christmas, but the theatres closed on Christmas Day. For many years the three theatre chaplains combined to host a Christmas evening party for the actors, especially the large cast of the panto who did not have enough time to go home, and would otherwise have been marooned in theatrical digs over Christmas night, before reporting for duty on Boxing Day.

On the way back home in a car late on Christmas evening, my feet had not touched the ground for about sixty hours, and I fell asleep in the back seat with my head on somebody's shoulder. Every day for the following week the temperature fell further. I don't think I have ever felt so cold in my life. On Sunday 30 December I rose to go to church for the 8.00 am service. When I opened the front door I was confronted by a wall of snow piled high against it. The wind had driven the snow in the streets into hills and

valleys, some as high as one's head. The cold continued for weeks, some drifts of snow remaining in side streets until April. It was very difficult trying to reach the elderly, the sick and the housebound to administer Holy Communion to them. In the New Year I was back at the Hippodrome on a weekday afternoon preparing, in one of the dressing rooms, some members of the Hippodrome cast for Confirmation, and in one case, Holy Baptism.

It was a strange start to my ministry, but not as strange as that of my vicar, who had arrived as a deacon at St. Helier, in Jersey in 1940, a few days ahead of the invading German army, and could not be ordained priest for another five years, when he was able to return to the mainland at the end of the war. *Revd Philip Hughes*
