THE COLLECT

Almighty God, who alone can bring order to the unruly wills and passions of sinful humanity: give your people grace so to love what you command and to desire what you promise, that, among the many changes of this world, our hearts may surely there be fixed where true joys are to be found; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

FIRST READING

Isaiah 58.1-9a

A reading from the Prophet of Isaiah

Thus says the Lord: Shout out, do not hold back! Lift up your voice like a trumpet! Announce to my people their rebellion, to the house of Jacob their sins. Yet day after day they seek me and delight to know my ways, as if they were a nation that practised righteousness and did not forsake the ordinance of their God; they ask of me righteous judgements, they delight to draw near to God. 'Why do we fast, but you do not see? Why humble ourselves, but you do not notice?' Look, you serve your own interest on your fast -day, and oppress all your workers. Look, you fast only to quarrel and to fight and to strike with a wicked fist. Such fasting as you do today will not make your voice heard on high. Is such the fast that I choose, a day to humble oneself? Is it to bow down the head like a bulrush, and to lie in sackcloth and ashes? Will you call this a fast, a day acceptable to the Lord? Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke? Is it not to share your bread with the hungry, and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, to cover them, and not to hide yourself from your own kin? Then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your healing shall spring up quickly; your vindicator shall go before you, the glory of the Lord shall be your rearguard. Then you

shall call, and the Lord will answer; you shall cry for help, and he will say, Here I am. If you remove the yoke from among you, the pointing of the finger, the speaking of evil.

SECOND READING 1 Corinthians 2.1-12

A reading from the First Letter to the Corinthians

When I came to you, brothers and sisters, I did not come proclaiming the mystery of God to you in lofty words or wisdom. For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified. And I came to you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling. My speech and my proclamation were not with plausible words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of the Spirit and of power, so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God.

Yet among the mature we do speak wisdom, though it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are doomed to perish. But we speak God's wisdom, secret and hidden, which God decreed before the ages for our glory. None of the rulers of this age understood this; for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. But, as it is written, 'What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the human heart conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him' — these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit; for the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God. For what human being knows what is truly human except the human spirit that is within? So also no one comprehends what is truly God's except the Spirit of God. Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit that is from God, so that we may understand the gifts bestowed on us by God.

THE GOSPEL Matthew 5.13-20

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew

Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus went up the mountain and was joined by his disciples. Then he began to teach them: 'You are the salt of the earth; but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything, but is thrown out and trampled under foot.

You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hidden. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven. Do not think that I have

come to abolish the law or the prophets; I have come not to abolish but to fulfil. For truly I tell you, until heaven and earth pass away, not one letter, not one stroke of a letter, will pass from the law until all is accomplished. Therefore, whoever breaks one of the least of these commandments, and teaches others to do the same, will be called least in the kingdom of heaven; but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, O Christ.

ORGAN INSTALLATION - EFFECTS OF SCAFFOLDING ON PERSHORE ABBEY:

With the scaffolding now in place to allow for the installation of the new organ, a few things will be different for a while.

- <u>LIVE STREAMING:</u> We may broadcast only one shot for an entire service or still pictures with sound due to impaired sight lines for our cameras. Services will still be broadcast, and you will be able to hear them even if the pictures are limited. 'Normal service will be resumed as soon as possible'. In the meantime, we hope you can still enjoy our services while we get ready for the organ to be ready.
- **FLOORING:** The floor of the Abbey has been covered in protective material for the installation of the scaffolding. We have decided that this temporary flooring will remain in place while work continues so that our main floor is safe. So please do be careful as some parts of the floor may be uneven.
- **LIGHT LEVELS:** The light levels in the Abbey have been affected by the scaffolding, so it will be a little darker in the pews. Please bear with us through this period.

MIKE PEGG FRCO: It was with great sadness that we heard of the death of Mike Pegg. For many years he was a faithful servant of the Abbey, sharing his musical skills and talent as our Director of Music. Mike faithfully travelled in to Pershore every Sunday to be with us and was part of some significant musical events in the life of the Abbey, including a recording of BBC Songs of Praise. This is very sad news for us as an Eco church and for myself and my helpers. I have personally been involved with TRAIDCRAFT since my daughters were small, well over 35 years now, in different churches and with different responsibilities.

Fighting poverty through trade Pershore Abbey has had a Traidcraft stall for a number of years.

There is over £500 of Traidcraft stock stored safely which we have access to. We have a rota for 2023 and so will continue with our twice monthly stall through February and into March until we know more about how this Administration will affect ordering and stock. At present I am unable to buy new stock or replenish sold stock, as the traidcraftshop.co.uk website which I use, is currently empty.

I'm hoping Traidcraft PLC will answer my queries soon, so we can continue to sell and order Traidcraft, even if it's only for few months.
