## THE LONG ROAD TO HEAVEN LENT GROUPS FROM THURSDAY 22 FEBRUARY

The Long Road to Heaven is a five-part study course based on the film The Way. Starring Martin Sheen as a bereaved father, this soulful and uplifting film observes a group of pilgrims walking the Way of St James to Santiago de Compostela. As it follows their journey of inner transformation, the course examines biblical accounts and images of salvation - past, present and future - and addresses the questions: What are we saved from? What are we saved for? Who can be saved? What do we have to do to be saved? How are we saved?

## **CHURCHES TOGETHER IN PERSHORE FOODBANK**

The Pershore Foodbank has been extremely well supported by our community throughout a challenging year. There was an overall increase of about 20% in the number of food parcels distributed and we have had to make regular buying trips to top up the groceries collected by means of your generous donations. That said; our finances remain healthy for the time being, thanks in part to the receipt of over a thousand pounds worth of cheques in just the week leading up to Christmas.

The Christmas period was enlivened for our clients by the delivery of over a hundred specially prepared hampers containing Christmas treats as well as the regular staples. This was all made possible by the extra donations collected by schools, churches and local businesses as well as the volunteers who had to go back and empty the overflowing supermarket collection bins several times a week. Various thoughtful initiatives, such as the Pershore High School Reverse Advent Calendar project, meant that there was more than enough to go around: longer dated items can be kept to bolster our stores for the coming months whilst any excess of the shortest dated (such as the inevitable 'mince pie mountain') have already been shared in the community.

People also helped in other ways: four young men from the Ridge and Partners Construction company gave up their spare time to join our warehouse teams and help with the heaviest work. We have also been joined by several new regular volunteers, bringing much-appreciated skills in computing, finance and personnel. Apart from helping to share load so that no one individual need ever feel overburdened, this has helped our overall resilience immeasurably.

With your continued support, the Pershore Foodbank aims to provide practical assistance to the most vulnerable residents of both he town and the surrounding villages. Foodbanks are generally formulated as a response to crisis but that can only be effective if people are be offered help accessing the type of services and advice that will help to lift them out of difficult times. We work in close concert with Citizens Advice, statutory services and local charitable organisations towards this objective but, at the same time, *do everything we can to ensure that no-one in our community need ever go hungry.*
