into action, into vulnerability, and into the streets.

We commit ourselves to work for change, and put ourselves on the line;

to bear responsibility, take risks,

live powerfully, and face humiliation;

to stand with those on the edge;

to choose life and be used by the Spirit,

for God's new community of hope. Amen
