The Gospel – John 12. 20-33

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

Glory to you, O Lord.

Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus.' Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour.

CAN YOU HELP US IMPROVE SAFEGUARDING IN THE DIOCESE? Our work in safeguarding is being audited and the auditors would like to hear from you! The Church of England has commissioned INEQE Safeguarding Group to conduct a

series of audits of dioceses to look at our work in safeguarding and suggest areas where we could make improvements. As part of this audit process, INEQE would like to hear from as many different people as possible from across our diocese and have put together an online survey through which individuals can comment in confidence about their impressions and experiences of safeguarding in the Diocese.



Please consider filling in this survey openly and honestly and letting the audit team know your opinions. Our audit will take place from 1 July, but the surveys are open now and will close at 11.30 pm on Wednesday 1 May 2024 to enable the audit team to go through them. We are proud 'parents' to Coco the cat and Merlin the wire fox terrier - he has saved you all from the organ works of Messiaen having eaten a whole volume of it last week! Although living in Cheltenham, we will surely be part of the community and want to invest our lives in the worshipping life and beating heart of the Abbey.

I have held organist positions at All Saints Leamington Spa, Cirencester Parish Church, Bath Abbey and most recently as Director of Music at All Saints Pittville in Cheltenham where I directed the Choir and played the Organ each week. I instituted an annual Cathedral singing visit together with Christ Church Cheltenham and also with them, a liturgical performance of The Crucifixion by John Stainer and Requiem by Gabriel Fauré. I am very keen to do this again in the future, to encourage more singers into the choir and to develop a children's choir too. I am also looking forward to getting to know the absolutely GLORIOUS instrument in the Abbey. The first time I played it made me really WANT to play. I openly and actively encourage any feedback at all, from you the Abbey family, what pieces you enjoy, want to hear, or never want to hear again!! I promise this will be an open relationship, with open dialogue, deep respect and lots of humour! Please come and talk to me at the console, I'm friendly and very approachable.
