FAIRTRADE AT PERSHORE ABBEY

FAIRTRADE RETURNS TO THE ABBEY: Fairtrade goods are once again available to buy in the Abbey, on the 1st and 3rd Sundays each month.

When Traidcraft ceased trading a new company, 'We Are Fair Trade', took up the challenge to provide all our usual favourites; tea, coffee, biscuits and sweets, continuing to connect us, as customers, with the Global South. "Why then do my biscuits come from

Scotland?" One customer asked; "And why are my Maltesers labelled Fairtrade?" The answer is that ingredients used to manufacture some goods in this country have been verified as meeting Fairtrade standards. This means that the farmers who grow these ingredients – cocoa, sugar etc – have been paid at least the Fairtrade minimum price and premium.

When you buy Fairtrade products you are helping to combat discrimination, combat child labour and support equality, helping to give farmers, artisans and producers the chance to lift themselves out of poverty and hopelessness.

CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE AT THE ABBEY

<u>CHILDREN'S GOOD FRIDAY ACTIVITY DAY:</u> This fun packed day in St Andrew's Centre was attended by 40 children aged 5–10yrs from the local community. As the children arrived, they all took part in an opening activity - making a collage of individual crosses formed into one large cross. During the morning, the children visited the Abbey and re-enacted the events leading up to Easter, singing and palm waving for Palm Sunday, feet washing on Maundy Thursday, sharing the meal at the Last Supper, the trial and crucifixion and ending celebrating the resurrection on Easter Sunday. After lunch, the children moved around the different activities in St Andrew's, making Easter cards, baking biscuits, decorating clay crosses, Easter baskets filled with chocolate eggs and creating their own Easter Garden. GOD AND THE BIG BANG, PERSHORE ABBEY 5 MARCH: Five members of the God and the Big Bang team from St John's College Durham arrived to deliver a day of discovery, discussion and debate on the compatibility of science and faith. A wonderful day was provided for the Year 5s from four of our local primary schools, with a total of 123 students and 11 staff attending.

There were four interactive workshop areas, led by scientists of faith, that the children rotated around in their school groups - Evolution & Genesis and how they came together, Mystery & Curiosity, Climate Change and the Big Bang Theory & God. The day started all together in the pews with a welcome and opening survey to complete fol-

lowed by a talk. After a break, the children took part in two of the interactive workshops. After lunch they had their final interactive workshop and then came back together for a Q&A session with the people from God and the Big Bang who had led the sessions. The day finished with the children completing a closing survey.

A massive thank you to Pershore Rotary for providing the majority of the funding for this event and to two members of our congregation - one who funded the bus for Pinvin school and one for making up the difference of the total bill. *Sam Andrews*

History of St Andrew's Centre

King Edward the Confessor, in the 11th Century, gave lands formerly belonging to Pershore Abbey to endow his cherished foundation at Westminster Abbey. St Andrew's was built to serve the tenants of the Abbot of Westminster.

Parts of the present building date back to 1170. Major alterations and additions were made in the 14th, 15th and 19th Centuries. Services of worship continued until the 1960s. The Abbey now rents the building and pays a rent of "a pound of Pershore plums" which is paid on August Bank Holiday Monday when Pershore holds its famous Plum Fayre at the end of the month long Plum Festival.

Today it is where many of our Church based activities take place. It has a ring of 8 bells enabling our ringers to practise on a lighter set and without having to climb the Abbey tower.
