THE COLLECT

Almighty God, you show to those who are in error the light of your truth, that they may return to the way of righteousness: grant to all those who are admitted into the fellowship of Christ's religion, that they may reject those things that are contrary to their profession, and follow all such things as are agreeable to the same; through our Lord Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

FIRST READING

Genesis 15.1-12,17-18

A reading from the Book of Genesis.

The word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision, 'Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great.' But Abram said, 'O Lord God, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?' And Abram said, 'You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir.' But the word of the Lord came to him, 'This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir.' He brought him outside and said, 'Look towards heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them.' Then he said to him, 'So shall your descendants be.' And he believed the Lord; and the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness.

Then he said to him, 'I am the Lord who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess.' But he said, 'O Lord God, how am I to know that I shall possess it?' He said to him, 'Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtle-dove, and a young pigeon.' He brought him all these and cut them in two, laying each half over against the other; but he did not cut the birds in two. And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away. As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell upon Abram, and a deep and terrifying darkness descended upon him.

When the sun had gone down and it was dark, a smoking fire-pot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces. On that day the Lord made a covenant with Abram,

saying, 'To your descendants I give this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river, the river Euphrates.'

SECOND READING Philippians 3.17-4.1

A reading from the Letter to the Philippians.

Brothers and sisters, join in imitating me, and observe those who live according to the example you have in us. For many live as enemies of the cross of Christ; I have often told you of them, and now I tell you even with tears. Their end is destruction; their god is the belly; and their glory is in their shame; their minds are set on earthly things. But our citizenship is in heaven, and it is from there that we are expecting a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ. He will transform the body of our humiliation that it may be conformed to the body of his glory, by the power that also enables him to make all things subject to himself. Therefore, my brothers and sisters, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, my beloved.

THE GOSPEL Luke 13.31-35

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

Glory to you, O Lord.

At that very hour some Pharisees came and said to him, 'Get away from here, for Herod wants to kill you.' He said to them, 'Go and tell that fox for me, "Listen, I am casting out demons and performing cures today and tomorrow, and on the third day I finish my work. Yet today, tomorrow, and the next day I must be on my way, because it is impossible for a prophet to be killed away from Jerusalem." Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing! See, your house is left to you. And I tell you, you will not see me until the time comes when you say, "Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord."'

PERSHORE ABBEY PCC REPORT

At our meeting on the 11th March, the PCC discussed a wide range of topics, including:

- Health & Safety policy documents were reviewed and approved. A copy of the Abbey H&S policy is available to view in the Flower Vestry, and the St Andrew's version is in the kitchen. The Benefice Office has a copy of both policies.
- Following on from our previous meeting, when James MacDowall-Scott (Director of Music) shared his ideas for musical provision at both the Abbey and in the community, the Mission Group (Vicar, Sam Andrews, Martin Fowler, Peter Stansbie and Suzanne Clarke) invited him to join the Group in making plans for his vision for musical outreach.
- Sam Andrews (Children & Families Worker) gave an encouraging report of the many interesting activities for children and families. The Babies & Toddlers Group continues to thrive and, over the past 3 months, Café Church has attracted between

4 and 10 children, plus 15 – 18 adults. Children from Stepping Stones Nursery visit the Abbey most Wednesday mornings, often bringing biscuits & cakes for 1000 Service refreshments. Plans are underway for another 'God and the Big Bang' workshop and a possible iSingPop workshop.

- As at every meeting, Suzanne Clarke (Safeguarding Officer) reviewed safeguarding procedures to ensure that we comply with the relevant regulations.
- Preparations for the APCM to be held on 6th May are well underway. Application forms for the new Electoral Roll are available. The Annual Accounts are being reviewed by the Independent Examiner. Two members of the PCC will be standing down should you be interested in joining the PCC, please contact Sara Speed (PCC Secretary).
