<u>A CELEBRATION:</u> Holy Week commemorates the seven days leading up to Easter, commencing with Palm Sunday, marking the triumphal entry of Jesus Christ into Jerusalem. Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey, while crowds waved palm branches shouting "Hosanna!" A procession, gathering at St Andrew's Road/Abbey Road at 1000, walking through Abbey Park to the Abbey, where the 1030 Sung Eucharist will take place, will remember this momentous day. The solemnity of Holy Week, culminates in the celebration of Easter and the resurrection of Jesus. VE DAY 80



Thursday 8 May 2025 marks 80 years since VE (Victory in Europe) Day when the Second World War came to an end in Europe. The anniversary is a time for the nation to come together to learn about the stories of those that served and the VE Day generation. To mark VE Day 80 there will be a special Sung Eucharist at Pershore Abbey at 1030 on Sunday 4 May, and the Abbey will be floodlit red, white and blue on 6 May, along with other national buildings. The Abbey will also be joining the national bell ringing event 1830-1930 on 8 May. Also taking place on 8 May will be the laying of a wreath at the war memorial, a gathering in Chapman Court, and a beacon being lit in Abbey Park - the timings of these events are to be confirmed.

APCM AND ELECTORAL ROLL NEWS

APCM MEETINGS: The Annual Parochial Church Meetings will be taking place in the benefice in April and May. They are an opportunity to reflect on the past year and to thank all those who have been involved in the life of our churches. Everyone is welcome to attend. The meetings are also when we elect and appoint officers for the current year - there is always room for volunteers who would like to serve as PCC members. PERSHORE ABBEY PEREGRINES

HERE WE GO AGAIN: It is now four years since our peregrine pair adopted the Abbey tower as their home, and last year their first success with hatching four chicks in early May. With the addition of a camera we were able to watch peregrine family life in the nest and wonderful parenting by Mr and Mrs P. Anxious moment for parents when the chicks were ringed but they were soon safely back for their dinner. As the chicks fledged we saw their antics on the tower and in the sky above. Early on, two had to be rescued from the ground and returned up the tower to improve their flying skills! One by one the young peregrines left home, one of them slow to make that final move.

By October all was quiet and steeplejacks came to empty and clean the platform. All

stones removed from the nest were laid out on a large wooden shelf outside – raked, weathered, cleaned with rainwater and returned to the nesting platform in January, inspected instantly by a peregrine just as one of our team was erecting the camera – face to face! Unperturbed, Mr and Mrs P are again on the tower, visiting their nesting place daily, moving the stones to their liking, having conversations and getting ready for egg laying, patient egg sitting, and hopefully successful hatching in due course.






