Welcome to the May 2025 Monthly Edition!

The weekly bulletin in our regular service sheet will keep you up to date with what's happening week by week.

JESUS' ASCENSION INTO HEAVEN: Ascension Day marks the end of the Easter season and the ascension of Jesus into heaven. After Jesus' crucifixion on Good Friday, he was resurrected from the dead in three days, on the day we know as Easter Sunday. For 40 days he stayed with his Apostles instructing them on how to carry out his teachings. At the end of day 40, Jesus and his disciples went to Mount Olivet, near Jerusalem. After asking them to stay, Jesus ascended to heaven to take his seat at the right hand of God. The ascension signifies that Jesus had completed his work on Earth and allowed him to prepare a place for his followers in heaven. Ascension Day is on Thursday 29 May and will be marked with a Benefice Sung Eucharist Service in Pershore Abbey at 1900.

2025 marks the 10th year of Thy Kingdom Come - a global ecumenical prayer movement that invites Christians around the world to pray from Ascension to Pentecost for more people to come to know Jesus. NEWS FROM THE PERSHORE ABBEY FABRIC UPDATE

2025 has already been busy with our regular maintenance of the Abbey and St Andrew's and alongside that we have been working with our architect, Joanna Daykin, towards attending to repairs and projects identified in the recent Quinquennial Inspection. Our first challenge is to adapt our heating system to use more sustainable energy as far as is possible towards the Net Zero carbon target by 2030 as set by the Church of England. Our big gas boiler is reaching the end of its life so for us this is even more urgent. Since 2021, a heating review led by David Oldham has examined our energy needs and alternative sources of energy, and the PCC has now engaged Greenways – Mechanical and Electrical Consultants to work with us and with our Architect to progress this project. We are looking towards a hybrid heating system using energy captured by solar panels and air source heat pumps, backed up with a smaller gas (condensing) boiler. We are sensitive to the importance of minimal visibility of installations, and permissions are still to be sought, but we are encouraged by the Diocese and hopeful of success. We look also to further developing our Abbey building, making best use of spaces available to us, small as they seem, with a long-term vision of expansion. *Judy Dale*

Since then the pair, mainly Mrs P, have been diligently sitting in turn to incubate their chicks and we have just received news that three chicks have hatched (correct at time of print). The first chick has been named Baby Francis. You can watch them too - at home, or you

EASTER WREATH FESTIVAL




OUTDOOR SERVICE


PERSHORE ABBEY CHOIR
