FIRST READING

Deuteronomy 30.9-14

A reading from the Book of Deuteronomy

Moses spoke to the people, saying, The Lord your God will make you abundantly prosperous in all your undertakings, in the fruit of your body, in the fruit of your livestock, and in the fruit of your soil. For the Lord will again take delight in prospering you, just as he delighted in prospering your ancestors, when you obey the Lord your God by observing his commandments and decrees that are written in this book of the law, because you turn to the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul.

Surely, this commandment that I am commanding you today is not too hard for you, nor is it too far away. It is not in heaven, that you should say, 'Who will go up to heaven for us, and get it for us so that we may hear it and observe it?' Neither is it beyond the sea, that you should say, 'Who will cross to the other side of the sea for us, and get it for us so that we may hear it and observe it?' No, the word is very near to you; it is in your mouth and in your heart for you to observe.

SECOND READING

Colossians 1.1-14

A reading from the Letter to the Colossians.

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and Timothy our brother, To the saints and faithful brothers and sisters in Christ in Colossae: Grace to you and peace from God our Father.

In our prayers for you we always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, for we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love that you have for all the saints, because of the hope laid up for you in heaven. You have heard of this hope before in

the word of the truth, the gospel that has come to you. Just as it is bearing fruit and growing in the whole world, so it has been bearing fruit among yourselves from the day you heard it and truly comprehended the grace of God. This you learned from Epaphras, our beloved fellow-servant. He is a faithful minister of Christ on your behalf, and he has made known to us your love in the Spirit.

For this reason, since the day we heard it, we have not ceased praying for you and asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of God's will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, so that you may lead lives worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him, as you bear fruit in every good work and as you grow in the knowledge of God. May you be made strong with all the strength that comes from his glorious power, and may you be prepared to endure everything with patience, while joyfully giving thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light. He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

THE GOSPEL

Luke 10.25-37

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

Glory to you, O Lord.

A lawyer stood up to test Jesus. 'Teacher,' he said, 'what must I do to inherit eternal life?' He said to him, 'What is written in the law? What do you read there?' He answered, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbour as yourself.' And he said to him, 'You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live.'

But wanting to justify himself, he asked Jesus, 'And who is my neighbour?' Jesus replied, 'A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead. Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan while travelling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, "Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend." Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?' He said, 'The one who showed him mercy.' Jesus said to him, 'Go and do likewise.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, O Christ.

NOTES FROM THE ABBEY PCC MEETING HELD ON 08.07.2025

The PCC met on 8 July with a busy agenda to work through. These are some of the highlights:

<u>Safeguarding</u> We completed the annual review of Church and Non-Church activities, as required by safeguarding protocols. Suzanne Clarke (*Parish Safeguarding Officer*) then led us through an online toolkit to consider ways to better support staff and volunteers in leadership roles. It was agreed that leaders of the various groups involved with vulnerable adults, or children and young people, should be offered the opportunity to meet and discuss their needs.

<u>Welcoming and Inclusion</u> The PCC discussed the importance of making everyone feel welcome and included whenever they attend services or visit the Abbey. We acknowledged that much has been done, but there is always room for improvement! Your ideas or comments would be welcome.

<u>Mission</u> Nicky von Benzon and Claire led the first "Walking Church" with 12 walkers and 3 dogs. It was interesting that 3 of the group were not involved in "church" but had seen the notices and decided to give it a try. All agreed it had been a most enjoyable experience – the next one will take place on 26 July, with Nigel Hawkes and Claire leading.

A meeting to discuss setting up a Dementia Church, and ways of making our buildings more dementia-friendly, is being planned. Anyone interested in joining the working group should contact Canon Claire.

James McDowall-Scott (*Director of Music*) has been working with Pershore High School and Pershore Choral, looking at ways of involving young people in choral music and possibly re-introducing choral scholarships. Sam Andrews (*Children & Families Worker*) will be running "Little Seeds" sessions on Friday mornings in August and there will be another Summer Activity Day on Tuesday 12 August in the Abbey. The "God and the Big Bang" team will be returning in September.

<u>Heating Project</u> The latest proposals for the new heating project were discussed – more from Judy Dale.

<u>St Andrew's Centre</u> The Benefice Office had received a very complimentary email from a hirer who had been impressed by the condition and cleanliness of the facilities provided. Good to hear from a satisfied customer! The consultation stage of transferring the ownership of St Andrew's Centre from the Church Commissioners to the PCC had been completed, but a final decision was awaited.
