The Gospel - Luke 11.1-13

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

He was praying in a certain place, and after he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, 'Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples.'He said to them, 'When you

pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread. And forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us. And do not bring us to the time of trial.'

And he said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say to him, "Friend, lend me three loaves of bread; for a friend of mine has arrived, and I have nothing to set before him." And he answers from within, "Do not bother me; the door has already been locked, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot get up and give you anything." I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, at least because of his persistence he will get up and give him whatever he needs.

'So I say to you, Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for a fish, will give a snake instead of a fish? Or if the child asks for an egg, will give a scorpion? If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'.

SUSTAINABLE HEATING FOR THE ABBEY: Since 2020 the Church of England has been looking to all churches to reduce their carbon emissions towards 'Net Zero' by 2030. The Abbey has had some success in moving to LED lighting, but the greatest amount of carbon we release to the atmosphere comes from our gas fired heating boiler, now over 20 years old and needing replacement. This is an opportunity for us to introduce more ECO friendly, sustainable ways of heating, and for several years the Fabric Committee has been investigating options, seeking advice from architects, consultant engineers and the DAC (Diocesan Advisory Committee). There are limitations as to what would be permitted, considering archaeology, architecture, and acceptability. The recommendation is that we continue with underfloor heating, using energy from solar panels and two air source heat pumps (ASHPs) working in a hybrid system with a smaller condensing gas boilerneeded in very cold weather. The only visible part of this would be the ASHPs which would need to be tucked outside the Abbey building at ground level, near the boiler house. The PCC has agreed that we move forward to seek the necessary permissions from Wychavon Planning and the Chancellor of the Diocese after which, if successful, we will be able to apply to find funding for the project.
