SALZWEDEL'S VISIT TO PERSHORE

On Thursday 29 May, ten people from Salzwedel in central Germany, with their pastor Matthias Friske, arrived in Birmingham to visit us here in Pershore. They spent a quiet day with their hosts before going to the Ascension Day Eucharist at the Abbey, where they were formally introduced to the congregation during the service.

Friday was our day for Tewkesbury and its Abbey. Michael Hodges provided local maps in German, so the visitors were able to go off and explore the area for themselves. In the afternoon we went to Ripple to see its beautiful old church and the magnificent misericords. There were one or two navigational mishaps, but we all finished the day with a bring-and-share supper in St Andrew's Centre with a slideshow of previous visits.


On Saturday we drove to Oxford. Mark Chapman had organised a few visits for the morning, including the University Church, crucial in the founding of the university, a typical small college — Brasenose — and Christ Church and the Cathedral. In the afternoon we went down to the river to see some of the action for the last day of the inter-college boat races and then returned to Pershore for a fish-and-chip supper and skittles.

Sunday morning saw us at a farewell breakfast in St Andrew's Centre before our visitors headed for the airport and back to Germany. Matthias thanked us for our warm welcome and said that Pershore was like a second home for them. He has already confirmed that we are invited to Germany for the 13 to 17 May 2026.

WHOLENESS & HEALING AT PERSHORE ABBEY

Why have Wholeness & Healing services? In the Eucharist we recognise that not everyone will feel able to access the healing ministry in this way, so we look to other services to share God's healing touch. Monsignor Michael Buckley DD quoted, 'what sacrament do you give to someone who has lost their job, their wife or children and who just cannot cope with life? We need to compliment the sacraments by trying to meet the needs of ordinary people in their daily lives.' On this foundation our services were established, with the emphasis of prayer being for 'wholeness', being in a right relationship with God, and for this reason we all need healing. Our services provide a time for quiet reflection, prayer and praise, with everyone receiving prayer themselves and being given a tealight acknowledging this and reminding them of the presence of the Holy Spirit, which they can place on the votive candle stand. We also have a private healing prayer list, prayed daily by team members and placed on the altar during services along with those left on the prayer board that month. So if you have a particular situation in your life or that of someone close to you needing prayer, consider coming along to one of our services, held on the second Sunday of each month at 1700 at the Abbey. PILGRIMS PAUSE AT PERSHORE ABBEY



A group of parishioners from St John Catholic Church in Tamworth recently visited Pershore Abbey whilst embarking on a walking pilgrimage following the local way of St Kenelm from Clent Hills to Winchcombe. This was a very important pilgrimage in the medieval times but has slipped into obscurity over the last few centuries. Group leader Stephan Benkert and fellow pilgrims attended Evening Prayer during their visit and explored the Abbey before continuing on their way.

They all safely reached their destination having reconnected with the old ways of pilgrimage, as they hoped, and having raised awareness of St Kenelm, their local Saint.



SAINT KENELM

Saint Kenelm is one of the most important Saints of medieval England. His legend identifies him as a member of the royal family of Mercia, a Boy-King, murdered to further the interests of an ambitious relative. After his body was concealed, it came to light by virtue of miraculous intervention and was transported by the Monks of Winchcombe to a major shrine where it was venerated for several hundred years.



The British Pilgrimage Trust aims to advance British pilgrimage as a form of cultural heritage that promotes holistic wellbeing, accessible to all. They seek to connect

people of all faiths and none to Britain's rich cultural heritage and natural beauty. From cathedrals and ancient trees to river sources, holy wells and standing stones, they invite everyone to embark on a personal journey that promotes holistic well-being through walking in the footsteps of our land's ancestors. The impressive display of over 600 cars is free to view and will be in Abbey Park. CHURCHES TOGETHER IN PERSHORE FOODBANK

Pershore Foodbank provides emergency support for people in crisis throughout the year. Our volunteers work hard to provide not just food parcels but also a friendly welcome and helpful advice.

The greater proportion of our clients come to us on no more than two or three occasions but we also have to recognise that some people continue to find it difficult to make ends meet. With your support, we aim never to have to turn away a family or individual in need. Over the summer we will again be offering additional support to families with children and so you can help us with donations of:

- Tinned meat & fish, soups and sauces, vegetables & fruit
- Pasta, rice and cereal. Biscuits, tea, coffee & longlife milk
- Soap, shampoo, dental & shaving supplies, nappies & detergent
- Household cleaning products, toilet paper, dog & cat food

We are very grateful to greengrocers Fruit Salad on the High Street for helping us to run our voucher scheme, supplementing the more basic supplies with some much appreciated fresh fruit and vegetables. If anyone would like to consider taking on sponsorship of this scheme, we would be happy to discuss it. It is also helpful to be able to offer people fresh toiletries during the hot weather. Nobody should have to feel that buying sun protection or deodorant has to be a special treat.

Rooftop Housing and Wychavon Council have been assisting us in our attempts to resolve the current warehouse issues but the amount of lifting and carrying required



to keep up the operation doesn't get any less so we are always on the lookout for people interested in joining us. Lastly, several of you make extremely generous financial donations to the Foodbank. I hesitate to ask for any more but we are always striving to make the best use of our resources and especially appreciate the reliability of regular donations, however small. *Nicola Ainsworth*




NEWS FROM ST JAMES', BIRLINGHAM
