

Find peace in His creation, between the broken and holy of mine. Forget all troubling burden, inspired to let your light shine.


How blessed to share his love and compassion, from blissful dawn to weary dusk.

On Tuesday 23 September we will be lighting up the Abbey blue in support of the charity Alex TLC and Leukodystrophy Awareness Month. Established in 2004, Alex TLC provides invaluable support and information to those affected by leukodystrophy.

Leukodystrophies are a group of rare genetic disorders that affect the central nervous system by disrupting the growth or the maintenance of the myelin sheath which insulates nerve cells. HIRING ST ANDREW'S CENTRE:

The Main Hall is suitable for up to 70 people, costs £15 per hour and includes the use of the kitchen. The Upper Room is suitable for up to 20 people and costs £10 per hour and includes the use of the kitchenette. HISTORY OF ST ANDREW'S CENTRE: Did you know that parts of the present building date back to 1170? King Edward the Confessor gave lands formerly belonging to Pershore Abbey to endow his cherished foundation at Westminster Abbey in the 11th Century. St Andrew's was then built to serve the tenants of the Abbot of Westminster. Major alterations and additions were made in the 14th, 15th and 19th Centuries, and services of worship continued until the 1960s. Interesting fact - it has a ring of 8 bells enabling ringers to practise on a lighter set, without having to climb the Abbey tower!

ST NICHOLAS, PINVIN

The roof repairs at St Nicholas, Pinvin are now complete, part funded by a grant from the diocese. The original plan was to repair the strip where the chancel butts up to the nave, which was allowing water to drip down the north wall inside the chancel. Once the roofing contractors exposed a test section, it was clear all the roof battens were rotten and a small section repair would only be a short-term fix. It was decided that for relatively little extra cost whole of the chancel north infrastructure could be replaced utilising the existing tiles. Additional official permissions were swiftly sought and approved for the necessary new battens, damp proof membrane and insulation in accordance with modern building regulations.

It is comforting that the leaky roof has now been resolved, but we wonder how long the other three sections of roof will survive before needing similar treatment. All this work has been thanks to the hard work, negotiations and funding organised by Glen Hurst, and thanks too to our contractors Reynolds Conservation, and our architect Stephen Oliver for his professionalism, and dedication.

LITTER PICK FILM 5 JULY 2025: The Litter Pick group in July watched an inspirational and hope-filled story by Dr Kinari Webb, that we thought was worth sharing with the whole church.

Two experiences changed Kinari's life. Working at 21 in the Borneo Rainforest tracking Orangutans, she got to know some loggers and why many take up logging as the only way to pay for medical crises. Secondly helping in the 2003 Tsunami

when locals affected asked for what they thought most important, but no one gave them that help. As a result, she co-founded 'Healing and Harmony', with its radical listening to local community solutions and offering health care that can be paid for with bartered goods, not just cash.

The result of acting on communities' consensus solutions resulted in a verified 90% reduction in logging over 10 years. Communities now have hope for their future, feel empowered at their own problem-solving ability and helped reforest the rainforest. The charity has since expanded to initiatives in Brazil and Ceylon. It has supported other organisations to ask the important questions of their communities. This has enabled one community find an alternative to selling their last piece of forest to the palm oil companies and rely on them for subsequent employment.




