<u>GOD'S WORD IS NOT CHAINED:</u> We will be observing Prisons Sunday at the Abbey's 1030 Sung Eucharist on 12 October, marking the beginning of Prisons Week, a time for prayer and reflection on issues related to the criminal justice system. Prison Sunday focusses on raising awareness and encouraging prayer for prisoners, their families, and those working within the criminal justice system. It serves as a reminder of the challenges faced by these individuals and promotes community support and action to address their needs. The theme of this year's Prison Week is 'Jesus looked at him and loved him' (Mark 10:21), emphasising compassion and support for those affected by imprisonment. *Turn to page 6 to find out more about this important week*.

MEET OUR NEW ARCHBISHOP OF CANTERBURY



Born in Woking in 1962, the Rt Revd and Rt Hon Dame Sarah Mullally DBE is one of four children, with two sisters and one brother. She attended Winston Churchill Comprehensive School and Woking Sixth Form College. She became a Christian at the age of 16.

Bishop Sarah was educated at South Bank Polytechnic and Heythrop College, University of London. Before being ordained, she worked as a nurse in the National Health Service, and in 1999, at the age of 37, was appointed the Government's Chief Nursing Officer for England in the Department of Health, the youngest person ever to be appointed to the post. Bishop Sarah was made a Dame Commander of the British Empire in 2005. While working as the Chief Nursing Officer for England, she discerned a call to ordination and was ordained in 2001 St Saviour's serving her curacy in Battersea Fields. In 2012, she was installed as Canon Treasurer at Salisbury Cathedral and three years later took the role as Suffragan Bishop of Crediton in the Diocese of Exeter. On 12 May 2018, Bishop Sarah was installed as the 133rd Bishop of London at St Paul's Cathedral, the first woman to hold the role. Bishop Sarah sits in the House of Lords as one of the Lords Spirituals. She was sworn in as a member of the Privy Council in 2018 and became Dean of Her Majesty's Chapels Royal in 2019. Bishop Sarah led the Church of England's Living in Love and Faith process from 2020 to 2023. This included the formative stages of discernment and decision making, which saw the introduction of the Prayers of Love and Faith for same-sex couples. She has served on the Church's National Safeguarding Steering Group and is also Lead Bishop for Health and Social Care issues. This year, she chaired the Triennium Funding Working Group that developed the Church of England's threeyear spending plan that led to significant investments in local churches and parish clergy.

Bishop Sarah is married to Eamonn, an Irish-born IT and Enterprise Architect who enjoys beekeeping and volunteering as a London tourist guide. The couple have two children, Liam and Grace. She has continued her interest in the health service and is Chair of Christian Aid. She has spoken openly about her dyslexia, describing her difficulties with writing and reading. In her spare time, she loves cooking, walking and pottery.

As a Benefice, let us pray for Bishop Sarah as she takes on this important role.

PRISONS WEEK AND PRISONS SUNDAY

"If prayer truly works, if our weak human rambling to God actually changes things, then we must call believing people to pray, and together we much pray for change where change is needed most."


Many things in life can bind us, fear, anger, abuse, rejection or shame. And this is as true for those held in prison as those who are not. And unless that bondage is addressed, the consequences can be dark. Hopelessness and helplessness can overwhelm, destructive behaviour continues unchecked - an imprisonment of body and soul. As we mark Prisons Week 2025, let us break those chains.

You can read full transcripts from people who have worked in or been caught up in the justice system at <u>prisonsweek.org</u> detailing their experience of having chains broken by God's grace. Reading them provides encouragement not to give up, to know we are loved by God and can be restored by those who love us and the communities we live in. So, join us in prayer, give thanks for God's grace and mercy and share God's work. Join us in this effort to approach God boldly that his unchained word might bring freedom to victims of crime, perpetrators, judges, prison officers, and prisoners.

The Abbey's Prison Sunday service will be at 1030 on 12 October when Mathew Farrow, Chaplain at HMP Eastwood Park, Gloucester, will be preaching.

AID TO UKRAINE

Thanks to a member of the Abbey community, we have become aware of an ongoing programme sending essential items to Ukraine, to ease the terrible conditions under which both military and civilians are living as a consequence of the war. We would like to support this programme, especially at this time of year as winter draws nearer and living conditions become even harder. We are therefore inviting donations of items in the following areas:

- Over the counter medicines (e.g. Pain killers, insect repellent, foot treatments)
- Tinned Food (Soup, meat, fish), Tea and Coffee (not in glass jars), Energy bars
- Clothing for troops (New Thick socks, Underwear)
- Baby items (Baby milk, Baby food, clothes in good condition, including knitted items, baby blankets, Nappies)

We are aware this appeal coincides with our usual Shoebox Appeal, which we do not want to detract from so, although toiletries are needed in Ukraine we are not including them in this appeal as they are always an important item in the Shoeboxes. There will be a box for donations in the Abbey from 12 October until 15 November, or contact Martin or Hilary Fowler on 01386 552243 if you would like anything collected. Our donations will be delivered to the Ukrainian Church in Gloucester and transported immediately to Ukraine. If you or someone you know is affected by loss, take care of yourselves and know that we are here for you now and throughout the year.




