FIRST READING Malachi 4.1-2a

A reading from the Book of Malachi

See, the day is coming, burning like an oven, when all the arrogant and all evildoers will be stubble; the day that comes shall burn them up, says the Lord of hosts, so that it will leave them neither root nor branch. But for you who revere my name the sun of righteousness shall rise, with healing in its wings.

SECOND READING 2 Thessalonians 3.6-13

A reading from the Second Letter to the Thessalonians

We command you, beloved, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to keep away from believers who are living in idleness and not according to the tradition that they received from us. For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not idle when we were with you, and we did not eat anyone's bread without paying for it; but with toil and labour we worked night and day, so that we might not burden any of you. This was not because we do not have that right, but in order to give you an example to imitate. For even when we were with you, we gave you this command: Anyone unwilling to work should not eat. For we hear that some of you are living in idleness, mere busybodies, not doing any work. Now such persons we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living. Brothers and sisters, do not be weary in doing what is right.

THE GOSPEL

Luke 21.5-19

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

Glory to you, O Lord.

When some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God, Jesus said, 'As for these things that you see, the days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down.' They asked him, 'Teacher, when will this be, and what will be the sign that this is about to take place?' And Jesus said, 'Beware that you are not led astray; for many will come in my name and say, "I am he!" and, "The time is near!" Do not go after them.

When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for these things must take place first, but the end will not follow immediately.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and plagues; and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven. But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name. This will give you an opportunity to testify. So make up your minds not to prepare your defence in advance; for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and friends; and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name. But not a hair of your head will perish. By your endurance you will gain your souls.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.



ABBEY PCC MEETING NOTES

The Abbey PCC met on Tuesday 11 November.

Judy Dale reported on the urgent repairs needed to the flying buttresses - please see her report in the weekly Bulletin.

We also discussed:

- Sam Andrews reported on the very successful "God and the Big Bang" event held in September. Over 120 pupils from 4 local primary schools spent the day finding out how faith and science can work together. Our thanks to Pershore Rotary for helping to fund transport costs.
- Children enjoyed taking part in the iSing Pop workshop held at Abbey Park Primary.
 An encouraging outcome was that 4 new families attended the October Café Church.
- The Wardens had attended a Diocesan conference focused on reaching out to residents of the many new housing developments.
- The Dementia Friendly Church Group had completed the toolkit audit and would now prioritise actions to be taken. Our work will link with the project to make Pershore a Dementia Friendly Town. During Dementia Awareness Week 2026, and as part of the Elgar Festival, arrangements have been made for a string quartet from the English Symphony Orchestra to perform a "relaxed" afternoon concert on 21 May at the Abbey. Those living with dementia and their carers will be invited to this free concert.
- New carpet tiles will be fitted to the raised area (former chancel) in the main hall of St Andrew's Centre (date in December to be confirmed).
- An unannounced hygiene inspection of the Lunch Club resulted in high praise for the standard of cleanliness of the kitchen – well done, Julie!
- There is a busy schedule of services and activities during Advent and Christmas with details available in the Bulletins and on the website. We look forward to welcoming you.
